TOP 5 VPN SERVICES FOR PERSONAL PRIVACY AND SECURITY

- I hope you decide to use a VPN on your portable devices as a minimum. Well worth it when traveling.
- A couple of tips based on my own experiences and from setting up home office networks for many people over the years.
- I use Hotspot Shield (https://www.hotspotshield.com/) for my tablet, phone and laptop. These are the devices I take with me when I travel and/or away from home. There is a "free" version but it comes with ads, of course. There is a paid version (Elite) no ads and has other nice features. I use the Elite version on all my devices. In fact, the Elite version let's you install it on more than 1 device, if I remember right.
- I was using SaferWeb (https://www.saferweb.com/)for my desktop but had some issues with it so I no longer use it. But it did have some very nice features and was easy to setup. Expensive.

MORE ABOUT VPN SERVICES

- Easy to setup but don't necessarily go for all the extra apps they'll want you to use as well. Check them out before you install/use them. Some of them are just a pain in the ass and not worth the trouble plus they have a slow down affect on your phone or tablet.
- ► Luse ESET Smart Security (https://www.eset.com/us/) on my desktop and laptop. Luse Lookout Mobile Security for my tablet and phone.

MORE INFORMATION

- My home network (wired and wireless), has a router with it's own firewall. All the home networks (private and for guests) are locked down with a password. Be sure to change the user name and password that comes with a router (or modem) from the factory or installed by your Internet Service Provider. Those user names and passwords are well known to the public and especially to hackers.
- In addition, I use the firewall that ESET Smart Security has built into it. Lookout Mobile Security does not have a built-in firewall but Windows 10 does and Android has a system function which acts something like a firewall.

MORE INFORMATION


- I use LastPass as my password manager. It is outstanding. They have a free version (with ads) and a paid version (no ads plus extra features). I highly recommend LastPass (www.lastpass.com).
- Be sure to UPDATE your security software regularly. Check the software and set it to auto update on a regular basis. Daily as a minimum.
- Also be sure you update your firewall software as needed and it is set to auto update.
- > Also be sure to update your operating system at least once a week.




VPN ON WIDNOWS X


